A huge thank you goes to Bobbie, and the next time you are in the Fiber Factory, please let Terri and Susan know how much we

appreciate them, too. The donor is Lauren Woodard and we would like to thank her as well. Unfortunately, we don't have any contact information for Lauren. If you know her, please let me know so we can track her down and thank her properly.

I'm looking forward to seeing all of you again, but sadly I will not be at the September meeting. I'll be on a trip to visit my mother and family in Milwaukee. Sharie will be conducting the meeting – and it will be a good one with lots of Show & Tells from workshops that our members attended. Last May, I proposed a Summer Challenge asking each of us to consider reinforcing your workshop skills by making an item for a future Telaraña raffle. It's been on my mind, but I must admit I haven't finished my project – yet. I will, I promise, and I hope that you will, too. We have all year ahead of us, right?

Board Meeting Minutes

August 26, 2009 Called to order 7:05pm.

In attendance: Nancy Wanek, Mary Snyder, Becky Helm, Bobbie Nash, Sharie Monsam, Gloria Traicoff, Ruth Teller, Clara Strode, Betz Frederick, Linda Wade.

Nancy opened the meeting with an announcement that the Guild had been given a picker that was left at the Fiber Factory with the request that it be donated to a guild. Bobbie Nash purchased it from Telaraña for \$500.

Nancy will be out of town at the time of our first general meeting; Sharie will substitute for her.

Most of the meeting was taken up with budget discussion. Last year, we cleared \$706.98. This year's income and expenses are expected to be similar with the exception of an added Publicity expense to print more Guild flyers for distribution at area fiber stores and at demos. It was agreed to budget \$125 for 200 new color flyers. No changes will be made to the layout, so that we can have them printed quickly at the

price quoted. Consideration will be made to substitute some of the pictures used in future orders. The printing costs were donated last year for the black-and-white flyers.

Newsletter: Costs are expected to be less this year, as we have ceased mailing copies to other guilds. Instead, they are sent by email only. At this time, no surcharge is added for members who receive their newsletter by postal mail, but might be considered in the future as a way to recoup printing and postal charges.

Gloria confirmed 59 members for last year. To stimulate increased membership, a suggestion was made to promote an introductory "student" membership at a reduced price, offered to those taking classes at Fiber Factory and Tempe Yarn and Fiber. Establishing a new membership level would likely require a change to the bylaws; instead a coupon discount could be offered. This would be of advantage in the ease of initiating and/or discontinuing the discount. No decision reached, will be reconsidered at later meeting.

Other means of promoting the Guild were discussed. A suggestion was made to hand out business cards at demos, perhaps instead of flyers. Bobbie volunteered to upload the template for a business card with Telaraña information, including meeting time/location, and a space to fill in a contact name and phone number. Members could download from our website and print for themselves as needed. Mary knew of a free source for cards online: VistaPrint. Their logo would appear on back of card. Will revisit at next meeting.

Betz will check to see if there will be any "guild" tables at Fibers Through Time, where we could sell our note cards and promote Telaraña.

Several members last year donated items they had made for our monthly raffles. Betz suggested that a donation receipt be given when an item is donated, such as those given by charities. Since we are non-profit, the donor can claim the donation on their tax returns. All agreed.

Hospitality: In connection with our December meeting, a special "Renaissance" dinner will be organized by the board members.

November 11: Telaraña's Tapestry Treasures

Our own **Mary Dieterich & Beverly Hunt** are accomplished tapestry weavers (and good friends) who have won many awards. One works large and the other exquisitely small. We've asked them to share with us their memories, their perspectives on fiber arts and their advice on how to get involved in juried shows.

Janet has taught at Stitches and many shops and guilds. Visit her website at www.bigskyknitting.com around the country, & is known as an excellent teacher and is also the author of Cables, Volume 1: The Basics: Aran Sweater Design and the "I Hate to Finish Sweaters" Guide.

1. Aran Sweater Design: Aran sweaters have tremendous appeal for knitters who like working textural stitches. Many knitters may be frightened away from designing and drafting their own Aran - problems such as picking compatible stitch patterns, working with multiple stitch gauges, and accommodating shaping can seem insurmountable. Once the basic concepts have been mastered though, Aran sweater design can be fun and challenging. Students will leave the class being able to design and draft a basic Aran sweater. 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Saturday, October 10th \$90 members (\$100 nonmembers).

2. Cables and Beyond: Take a trip around the world of cables. Experiment with the slip-stitch cables, cables and lace, infinite cables, modular cables, cables and color, and many other techniques. 9 a.m. – 12 noon. Sunday, October 11th \$45 members (\$50 nonmembers).

3. Let Them Eat Cake! Brioche stitches - wonderfully fun family of stitches. Using just a few easy techniques, create soft, lofty stitch patterns suitable for use in scarves, blankets and other projects. This class also features a section on combining cables and brioche stitches for students who want a cabling emphasis. 1 p.m. – 4 p.m. Sunday October 11th \$45 members (\$50 nonmembers).

4. Finishing Before You Start: What happens at the start of a project determines what the project will look like when it's done. This class teaches the basics of finishing while emphasizing the importance of planning for good finishing before the first stitch is cast onto the needles. 9 a.m.- 12 noon Monday, October 12, 2009 \$45 members (\$50 nonmembers)

5. Fitting Your Knitting: Are you tired of making sweaters that don't fit? This class helps you knit sweaters that fit the recipient (you or someone else) perfectly. Learn about measurements and ease, adding bust darts, waist shaping, and other figure-flattering tips and tricks to make your next sweater project a success. 1 p.m.-4 p.m. Monday, October 12th \$45 members (\$50 nonmembers).
